

Scott E. Schimmel is a Hawaii based environmental scientist and documentary filmmaker. His award winning work has screened at festivals around the world. His films have explored topics such as the fight against poverty and hunger in North Carolina, the challenges of coastal sustainability in Belize, the triumph of overcoming the limitations of disability, and the struggles to adapt to a changing climate in Vanuatu. Scott has produced videos for a variety of clients including Wake Forest University and World Wildlife Fund. In addition to filmmaking, Scott is an Assistant Professor in the School of Communications at the University of Hawaii Manoa and has worked internationally as a consultant on environmental and climate related projects in the Western Pacific and Oceania.

The people of Vanuatu, a country once dubbed the happiest place on earth, face a grim future as climate change threatens their culture and traditions. My Garden, No Longer gives a voice to the people of Malekula Island in Vanuatu as they discuss the impacts that climate change is having on their lives.
